This email is for students who have already signed up to take one or more AP Tests. If your student did not sign up to take any AP Tests, please disregard this email.

AP Testing is quickly approaching! This email is to be used as a resource to help answer any preliminary questions you may have regarding AP Testing.

EXAM SCHEDULE/TESTING DAY INFORMATION - IN PERSON

- (PAPER/PENCIL) AP Testing will occur between **May 6 – May 23**. Please note that these dates and times are set by the College Board and must be followed.

- Morning sessions start at 7:30 am and afternoon sessions start at 11:30 am.
- If a student does not show up for an exam that was ordered for them, they will be charged the \$40 fee per exam they miss.

HOW DO AP TESTS WORK?

Most AP tests are two to three hours long and consist of two sections:

- SECTION 1: Multiple Choice
- SECTION 2: Long Response (Essay)
- AP Scores will be made available to students the first full week of July via the student's College Board account. Students will receive a score between 1 and 5.
